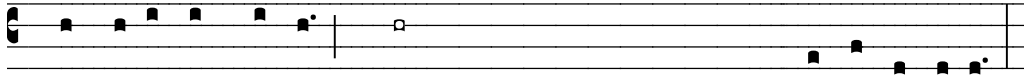
Each Easter – as on each Sunday – the Holy Church makes present the great



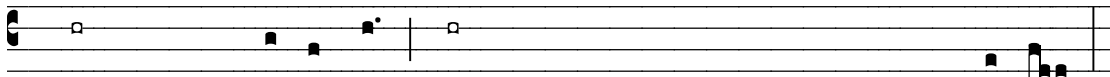

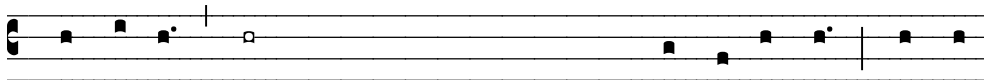
From Eas-ter are reckoned all the days we keep ho-ly. Ash Wednesday,



the beginning of Lent, will occur on the twenty-second of Fe-bru-a-ry.



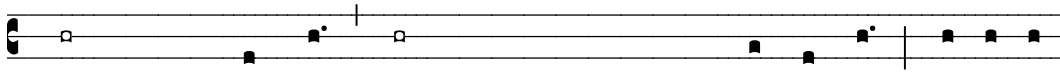
The Ascension of the Lord will be commemorated on the seventeenth of May.



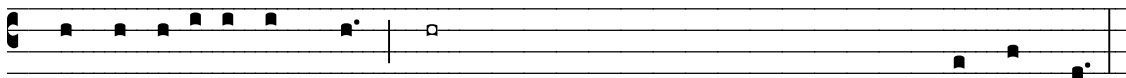
Pen-te-cost, the joyful conclusion of the sea-son of Eas-ter, will be
