This degree requires 36 graduate credit hours:

- One core course in New Testament (3 credit hours)
- Early Church History (3 credit hours)
- The Creed in History and Theology (3 credit hours)
- Eight Electives (24 credit hours), determined in consultation with the program director to meet learning outcomes for the degree and your personal learning goals.
- Concluding Exercise (3 credit hours)



Whether you are in a ministerial or secular career, a master's degree can be especially useful for those interested in the ministry of teaching the faith, for those in caring professions and leadership roles, and for those preparing for further graduate theological studies.

Courses are available in a variety of formats (weekday, weekend, and intensive residency), allowing for part-time or full-time study. Up to three-fourths of one's study may be completed online.

Students pursuing the Master of Arts (Theology) investigate the sources and resources of the Catholic tradition. Specializations are available in the areas of Ethics and Moral Theology, Liturgical and Sacramental Theology, Spirituality, Church History, Systematic Theology, Scripture, and Pastoral Studies.

PREREQUISITES

Applicants must have a four-year undergraduate degree, in any field, from an accredited institution of higher learning. In rare instances, we can accept students who have not completed an entire bachelor's degree. Those with some theological background may be able to earn transfer credit.
